

### Think and Write

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Look at this picture. What words and sentences does it make you **think** of? We are going to **write** some sentences based on the picture using the following pattern of sentences. Remember to say your sentence out loud first before you write it!

Sentence 1 Write a sentence about the cake that ends in a **full stop** (.).

Sentence 2 Write a sentence about **who** is eating the cake, using a **capital letter (A)** for their name.

Sentence 3 Use a word that ends in **-est.** 

Sentence 4 Write a sentence using **two** of these common exception words: **were, full, she, says, so, said.** 

Read through your passage carefully – does it include everything we are looking for?

# Example Answers



Here's an example of what you could have thought and written...

The squidgy, chocolaty cake is delicious.

Daisy loves to eat cake and chocolate is her favourite.

This is the **softest**, **sweetest** cake she has ever eaten.

She says she is nearly full so I might have to eat some!

Here's an example of what you could have thought and written...

Have you ever seen this many rubber ducks out on their own?

They are going to **London** to visit the Queen.

The ducks are wearing their best hats.

Some of the naughty ducks are trying to push to the front.

### Think and Write

Sentence 2 Use a word that ends in -er or -est.

Sentence 4 Write a sentence using **two** of these common exception words: **we, do, come, here, one, friend.**

# Example Answers



Here's an example of what you could have thought and written...

I love jumping on the trampoline at the beach.

I can jump the **highest** but my friend can jump **faster** than me.

We have been on holiday since **Monday** and I don't want to go home!

I do hope we will come here again one day.
