Singular Possessive Apostrophe

This is used if there is only one person or thing and something belongs to that person or object.

Eg The boy's wispy hair fluttered in the wind. John's ruby hat fitted snuggly on his head. The elderly man's pointed nose was red from the cold wind. The washing line's rope had become slack.
