



Writing Checklist





Reception teachers say you need a **CAPITAL LETTER** at the start of your sentence.



Reception teachers say you need a **full stop** at the end of your sentence.



Reception teachers say you need **finger spaces** in between your words.



Reception teachers say you need to **check** your sentence to see if it **sounds right**.


Reception teachers say it is important we try to form all of our letters correctly. To the right is an example of how we should be forming each letter in the alphabet. A great (and fun) way to practise your handwriting is by drawing letters in the sand, using chalk on the ground or making them using playdough!

Once you are feeling confident forming your letters, have a go at joining your digraph sounds. You can see the joins (to the left) we use at school.

Reception teachers say you should sound out your words as you are writing. If you are unsure of a sound use the sound mats below!
