What is Google Classroom?

Google Classroom is part of G Suite, a package of cloud-based services that can provide your child with a new way to work together online.

Google Classroom is a free Google App that aims to simplify creating, distributing and assessing learning in a paperless way. Teachers can use Google Classroom to share resources, lesson notes, PowerPoints, tasks, and home learning. Pupils can use it to access work covered in class in school, at home or on the go and complete home learning.

It is a free resource that can be accessed from any device connected to the internet - laptops, desktop computers, chromebooks, tablets or mobile phones.

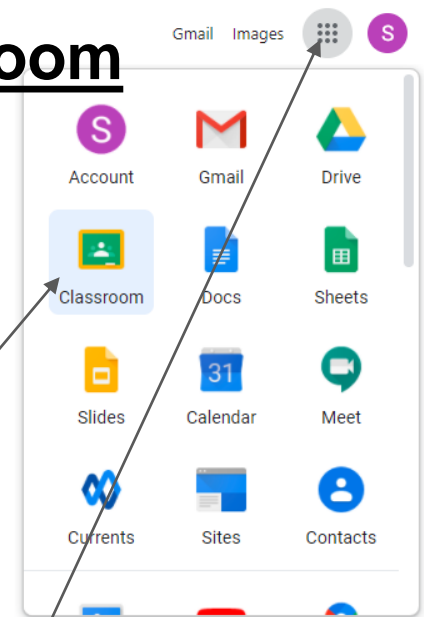
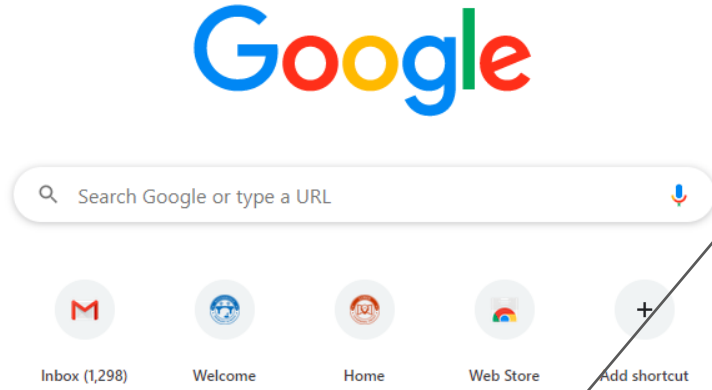
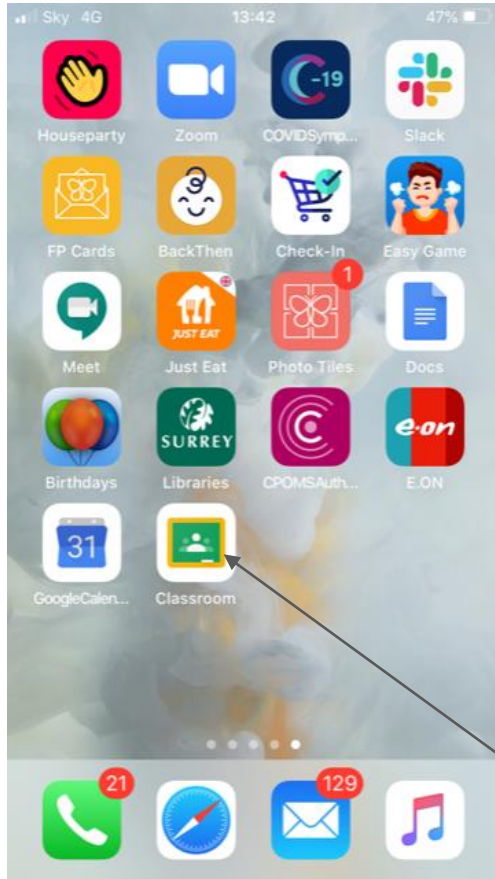

How to access Google Classroom



Google Classroom is accessed using the Classroom icon. Use the 9 dots ('Apps Chooser') to select Google Classroom or use the icon on the home screen on a device.

How to access Google Classroom (cont.)

Pupils can access Google Classroom using the mobile apps (Android and iOS), or via a web browser by visiting www.classroom.google.com . They should sign in using their @lumenlearningtrust.co.uk email address that they have been given by their teacher. Once pupils have logged in, they will see the class overview page. From here they can see all of the classes they are registered with and a summary of any work due. Clicking on a class will open that Classroom.

Accessing Resources

If pupils are accessing Google classroom from a mobile device, they should download the appropriate Google Apps to make best use of the shared resources. The most useful Google apps are: Classroom, Calendar, Docs and Drive.

If using a browser, it is easiest to use Google Chrome to access, but is possible on any web browser. Be sure to log in using your @lumenlearningtrust.co.uk email.

When home learning is set online, it can be submitted directly within Google Classroom online without needing to be printed. To open the home learning, click on the Open button on the appropriate post in the Stream page. You will then see the description and any attached documents.

How to share your learning with teachers: **‘Turn in’ or Hand in**

The simplest way to complete the home learning online is to open the attachment and complete your assignment in this document. When you are finished, click on the MARK AS DONE button. You can even add your own attachments to your submission, such as photos, audio clips, videos, etc. Once the home learning has been marked by the teacher, you can see feedback and any comments made by the teacher by opening the home learning task as before.

If it is not possible to make changes to the document, download and make changes or upload a picture of the work you have done on paper.



How to edit a document

Google has apps that allow you to use the equivalent tools to Microsoft Office.

You can use either Google apps or Microsoft Office, however to turn in learning, using Google Apps is easier when each child has their own copy and we will start to encourage children to learn to use these apps in school.

Sometimes, learning will need to be 'Opened with' a different app or tool. Where this is the case, learning will not be turned in via apps.
