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Remembrance Day

Yesterday and today in assemblies we have recognised Remembrance Day. Today we held our two-minutes' silence and the children were very respectful during this time; particularly in KS2, earning every child a green point.

Anti-Bullying Week

This week has been Anti-Bullying Week and the children have spent lots of time in class and during assemblies talking about what bullying is, what we should do if it happens and how to prevent it from happening in the first place. One of the key discussion points is about 'hitting back'. Children tell us that at home, they are told to hit back if someone hits them first. This isn't the message we give in school and any child who is physical - regardless of who hit first - will be moved to red and have a consequence for this. We want to teach children about positive conflict resolution which will support them as adults. We would really welcome your support in this message too.

Reading Workshop & Visits to Classes

A huge thank you to everyone in Years 2-6 who came to our Reading workshop on Wednesday and then visited their child in class. We had brilliant attendance of 183 children represented! 
Surrey Link Travel Card

This week's recommendation is from Mrs Vale and is 'The Library Lion' by Michelle Knudson.



KS2 Poster Competition

We would like to invite children from Years 3 to Year 6 to be the driving force behind the campaign and create new posters that the Council will use. The posters will also be used on social media and on our digital screens, put on display in our community noticeboards, in our parks and highstreets and featured in the spring Bulletin magazine, delivered to 40,000 homes.

The six themes of the campaign are:
