Dear RGM and RB families,

Last week we spoke in class about friendship and kindness (our Reception focus for Anti-Bullying Week). The children have spoken about what makes a good friend and shown some lovely acts of kindness. We have a Proud Jar in our classrooms and anyone who shows exceptional kindness has their name put in the jar. At the end of the term a name will get pulled out at random and that person will have some reward time and take part in an activity of their choice.

**Reading Books, library books and phonics home learning**

Just a reminder that reading books and phonics learning will continue to be sent home on a Friday. Please ensure these are returned each Wednesday.

The reading books match your child's phonics level. These books will be introduced during the week in our 'Guided Reading' sessions. It is crucial that these books are re-read at home to consolidate learning and build comprehension and understanding. The children will be very excited to show off their super reading with you and will hopefully feel empowered by accessing a book they are familiar with. At the moment we are focussing on recognising the sounds in a word and then blending them together to read the word.

**Dates for your diaries**

On **Friday 17<sup>th</sup> November** we will be fundraising for BBC Children in Need. The theme this year is Be SPOTacular and children can wear something spotty to school for a suggested donation of £1. This can be a top, trousers, socks, dress, accessories or whole outfit! **English**

In Our English learning this term, we will be exploring a wide range of fairy tales. We will also read lots of the same fairy tales written by different authors. You can support this at home by also sharing fairy tales together and picking up on key language such as "once upon a time" and "they all lived happily ever after..." Can you retell and act out favourite fairy tales through play? Can you create your own fairy tale?



## Arts and Crafts

The Reception children love arts and crafts activities! To support them in this we would really appreciate any donations of craft resources; craft lollipop sticks, pom poms, foam shapes, paper squares, sequins, coloured paper, poster paints etc. If you have anything lying around at home not being used we will make good use of it! Thank you so much.

## Maths

This week we are learning to identify number bonds to 5.

Examples of questions/stem sentences used in class: "How many ways can you make the number 5?"

- UW (Understanding the World) – thinking about fairytale environments, looking for signs of Autumn

- EAD (Expressive arts and design) – Using story language to enhance our play, creating fairy tale scenes and settings
- PD (Physical development)-This term we will continue to develop 'Body Management' skills
- RE (Religious Education) – Why do we have celebrations?
