Children's Mental Health Week

School Uniform Changes & Price Increase

Families may remember that I shared in the Autumn Term that we are finally moving our uniform over to the new Saxon logo. This will be a phased change with all new Reception children joining us in September with the new logo on their uniform. Once KS Teamwear have used up all of their current stock with the old logo on it, families will only be able to buy uniform with the new logo on. This change is likely to take place from the Easter holidays due stock levels. Any current uniform can still be worn until such time as it's no longer in good condition or your child has outgrown it.

KS Teamwear have notified us that the cost of uniform will be increasing from the 1st March. Please note, this is not in relation to our change of logo but due to an increase in cost from their supplier. The next few weeks are a good time to go and get any new uniform you might need at the cheaper price.

A reminder that the children can wear their Brownies/Cubs/Rainbows uniforms etc. on Thursday 22nd February to celebrate this national day.

The children don't have to submit it to the School of Kindness. Any children who do take part should also bring their form into school after half term to show Miss Morris in order to get a slip in the proud jar.


