'Getting it Right for Children' is a course designed to help parents who are separating or are separated who want to reduce conflict and better communicate with the child's other parent, for the best interests of the child.

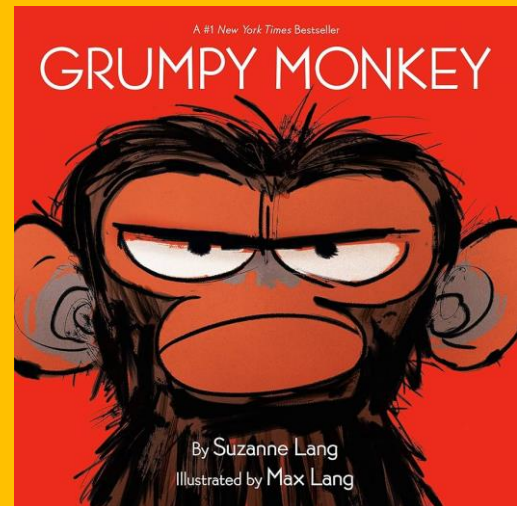

Eat it Up Café Recipe

Mini Lunchbox Quiches for Healthy Lunches



Mini crustless quiches with no pastry, perfect for lunchboxes or even breakfast. Filled with peppers, mushrooms and tasty ham, this healthy mini quiche recipe also happen to be gluten free.

Prep Time 10minutes

Cook Time 30minutes

Total Time 40minutes

Ingredients

- Olive oil for greasing
- 6 -8 Ham slices
- 8 Eggs medium
- 150ml Milk whichever type you have is fine
- 300g Mixed veg of whatever you fancy
- 12 Cherry tomatoes
- 100g Cheddar cheese grated

Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 180C.
2. Grease a 12 hole muffin tray well with olive oil.
3. Cut each ham slice in half lengthways and use it to line the bottom and sides of each muffin hole.
4. In a jug, beat the eggs and milk.
5. Put a little of the vegetables into each tin.
6. Top with half a tomato and some cheese.
7. Pour the egg mixture evenly between each mini quiche.
8. Bake for 25 - 30 minutes or until well risen and golden.
