SPELTHORNE SCHOOLS' PRAYER GROUP



Think "Pharmacy First" for your Child

GP practices can be very busy and sometimes your child might not need an appointment. If your child has any of the conditioons listed below, you can go straight to your local pharmacy instead of waiting to see a GP. A trained clinical professional at the pharmacy can talk tol you, give advice, and even provide medicine if needed, helping your child feel better sooner.

- Pharmacies can help with these four common conditions in school-age children:
- Earache (ages 1-17)
- Sore throat (ages 5 and older)
- Infected insect bits (ages 1 and older)
- Impetigo (ages 1 and older)

Most community pharmacies in Surrey offer the Pharmacy First service. This means you can get quick help for these issues without seeing a GP first. So, if your child has an earache, sore throat, impetigo, or a suspected infected insect bite, remember to visit the pharmacy first.

For parents in Surrey Think Pharmacy First for your child Surrey Heartlands Pharmacies can now offer appointment, with medication available if required, for four conditions that affect school-age Earache (Children Ear ache (children aged 1-17) ged 1 to 17 Sore throat (over 5s) Infected insect bites (over 1s) Impetigo (over 1s) GP practices are busy and an appointment is not always necessary. When your child is ill with any of the above conditions, by going straight to a local pharmacy, you can have a consultation with a trained clinical Infected Insect Bite professional and receive advice or Impetigo and even medication if it is needed. Children and adults age 1 meaning they could be on the road to recovery as soon as possible. The majority of Surrey community pharmacies offer the Pharmacy First service. Remember - if your child has an ear ache, sore throat, impetigo symptoms or suspected infected

insect bite, think Pharmacy First.
